



The EWB-UK Bursaries scheme provides funding for member-initiated non-EWB-UK learning opportunities, research projects and volunteer placements which contribute to the personal development of our members and benefit partner development organisations. Since 2005, the bursary scheme has provided funding for 30 projects in 25 countries over £10,000.

- Develop communication skills;
